WHAT IS THE PURPOSE OF THIS SECTION 106 SCOPING MEETING?

Throughout Section 106 review, federal agencies must consider the views of the public. This is particularly important when an agency is trying to identify historic properties that might be affected by a project and is considering ways to avoid or minimize harm.

By keeping abreast of federal involvement, participating in consultation, and knowing when and whom to ask for help, you can play an active role in deciding the future of your community.

The Section 106 process is conducted in 4 basic steps:

- Initiate 106 Process
- Identify Historic Properties
- Access Adverse Effects
- Resolve Adverse Effects

Section 106 review gives you a chance to comment when proposed actions could affect historic properties.



WHAT IS THE PURPOSE OF THIS NEPA SCOPING MEETING?

NEPA scoping is a public process designed to solicit public and agency comments regarding issues that an environmental document should consider.

This NEPA scoping meeting aims to:

- Present an overview of the Iberville Redevelopment
- Describe the Environmental Review Process
- Provide opportunities to provide input
