

# **COMBINED NOTICE OF FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT AND INTENT TO REQUEST RELEASE OF FUNDS**

This Notice shall satisfy the above-cited two separate but related procedural notification requirements.

## **REQUEST FOR RELEASE OF FUNDS:**

On or about March 29, 2013 the City of New Orleans (City) will submit a request to Louisiana State Office of Community Development (LOCD) for the release of funds under the FY 2006 Department of Defense Appropriations Act, in accordance with the "Notice of Funding Availability" published in the Federal Register on February 13, 2006, in order to fund the project known as the Iberville Infrastructure Redevelopment which is being done in conjunction with the Iberville Choice Neighborhoods Initiative Development for the redevelopment of the Iberville Public Housing Development. The D-CDBG funds will be used to provide soft second assistance and for the demolition of roadways and utilities, the installation of new concrete streets, utilities, drainage infrastructure, curbs, sidewalks, street lights, planting/landscaping, and tree preservation. The infrastructure portion will take place: Treme St. between Iberville St. and Conti St., N. Villere St. between Iberville St. and Conti St., Bienville St. between N. Robertson St. and Crozat St., Marais St. between Iberville St. and St. Louis St., and Conti St. between N. Villere St. and Treme St. All work will be performed in compliance with the Programmatic Agreement among the City of New Orleans, HANO, Louisiana State Historic Preservation Office and the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation. The project will also adhere to all local, state, and federal statutes, laws and ordinances in the construction and redevelopment of the project. Approximately \$12,000,000.00 in D-CDBG funds under grant number B—6-DG-22-0001 will be used to fund this project.

The Iberville Choice Neighborhoods Initiative Development undertaking is being funded with Choice Neighborhood Initiative (CNI) funds which will be released by Department of Housing and Urban Affairs. A separate Combined Notice is being published with a detail project description for the public input.

## **FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT**

The City of New Orleans has determined that the project will have no significant impact on the human environment. Therefore, an Environmental Impact Statement under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (NEPA) is not required. **RELEASE OF FUNDS:**

The City of New Orleans certifies to LOCD that Cedric S. Grant, in his capacity as Deputy Mayor for Facilities, Infrastructure, and Community Development for the City of New Orleans consents to accept the jurisdiction of the Federal Courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to the environmental review process and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. LOCD's approval of the certification satisfies its responsibilities under NEPA and related laws and authorities, and allows the City of New Orleans to use Program Funds.

**OBJECTIONS TO RELEASE OF FUNDS:**

The Louisiana State Office of Community Development will accept objections to its release of funds and the City of New Orleans' certification received by April 15, 2013 or a period of fifteen days from its receipt of the request (whichever is later) only if they are on one of the following bases: (a) the certification was not executed by the Certifying Officer or other officer of the City of New Orleans; (b) the City of New Orleans has omitted a step or failed to make a decision or finding required by HUD regulations at 24 CFR Part 58; (c) the grant recipient or other participants in the project have committed funds or incurred costs not authorized by 24 CFR Part 58 before approval of a release of funds by the City of New Orleans; or (d) another Federal agency acting pursuant to 40 CFR Part 1504 has submitted a written finding that the project is unsatisfactory from the standpoint of environmental quality. Objections must be prepared and submitted in accordance with the required procedures (24 CFR Part 58) and shall be addressed to:
